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

PROGRAMS AND APPS



- **Microsoft Teams** will be used as our main platform for class meetings, student support office hours, and announcements. (A mobile app is also available which makes it easier for submitting photo projects straight from your phone.)
- **OneDrive** is free cloud storage provided by our school district. I recommend saving your work here (many of you already use it).
- **Snapseed** is a free photo editing mobile app that will be used in addition to the phone's in-camera editing features.
- **PiCollage** is a free mobile app that will sometimes be used when turning in a series of photos. If you already have a collage app, that should work as well.
- **Photopea.com** is a free web based program for photo editing that resembles Adobe Photoshop. We may use this for a couple projects.
- **Focos** is a free mobile app that allows manipulation of aperture f-stops.
- **Yamera, Raw+, or Lightroom** are free apps that allow manipulation of shutter speeds.
